Overview

In December 2019, Governor Tim Walz signed Executive Order 19-37, reiterating the size and scope of the climate crisis and the need to protect all Minnesotans from the most severe economic, health, and ecological impacts. Minnesota is also guided by the 2007 Next Generation Energy Act, which set goals to reduce GHG emissions in the state 30% by 2025 (from 2005 levels) and 80% by 2050. Minnesota did not meet its 2015 goal of 15% reduction, and we're not on track to meet the 2025 goal either. We must redouble our efforts to meet future goals.

To address the climate crisis, our state government must work across the enterprise in a coordinated approach. The Climate Change Subcabinet unites state government leaders under one common goal: identifying innovative policies and strategies to mitigate climate change and achieve greater resilience. The Environmental Quality Board (EQB) carries out a work plan that includes projects related to climate change mitigation and resiliency.

Today's meeting will give members of the public a chance to hear updates on the work of Subcabinet to date, learn about next steps, ask questions about vision and progress, and explore opportunities to get involved.

Objectives:

- Build a shared vision on climate across the EQB and the Climate Change Subcabinet
- Share about the work of the Climate Change Subcabinet, including how it is being structured and organized across agencies
- Introduce the Subcabinet's vision for engaging Minnesotans on climate change and invite public input and involvement
- Announce Our Minnesota Climate Forum Series
- Communicate about opportunities to stay involved and collaborate

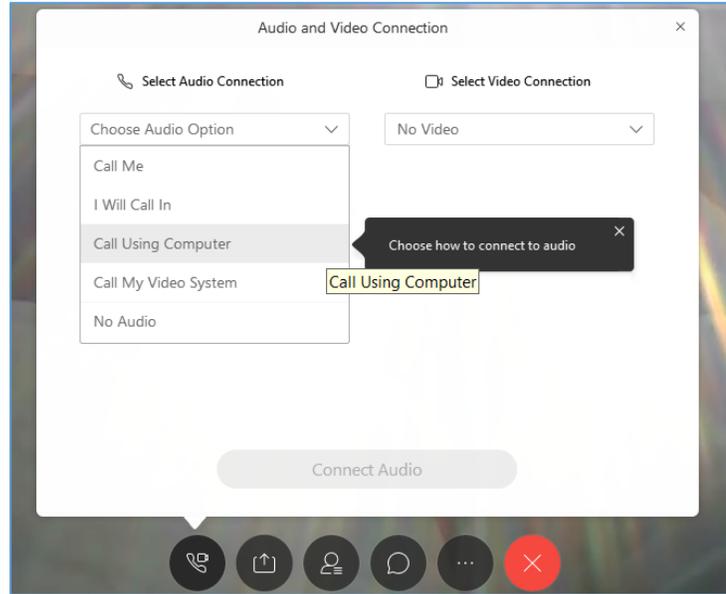
Step 3: If you have not already used WebEx before, follow the prompts to download the plug-in for your web browser. This typically does not take long, but be sure to budget time in advanced to connect to the meeting.

Step 1 of 2: Download the Webex application

You will need to download this application once to join a meeting with Microsoft Edge.

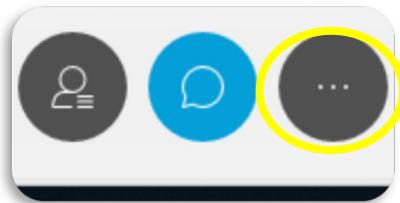
Step 4: Configure your Audio and Video Connection, if you wish to use your computer's microphone and camera, select "Call Using Computer." If you prefer to connect by phone you can either call in or have the WebEx system call a number that you provide.

Note: you will be muted upon entry to the conference call. If you are joining audio by phone, you will only be able to unmute through your computer.



Having trouble with audio? Try joining by phone.

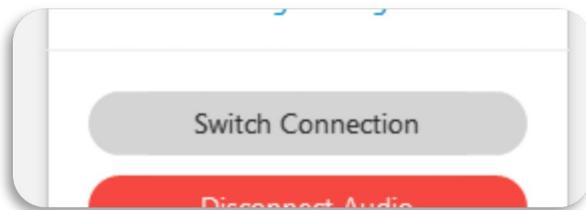
Step 1: Open the options by selecting the three dots icon.
