## **Updated climate guidance**

We recently updated the Climate Guidance which helps users answer climate mitigation and climate adaptation questions on the environmental assessment worksheet (EAW). This is a technical update that reflects the newest tools and instructions for their use. This guidance provides steps to assemble a carbon footprint, assess mitigation options, and identify adaptation measures. This update includes references to the new version of Minnesota CliMAT – Climate Mapping and Analysis Tool (CMIP6). ## **METRO Blue Line Light Rail Transit (BLRT) Extension**

Location (city/township; county): Crystal, Minneapolis, Robbinsdale, Brooklyn

**End of comment period:** August 6, 2024

**Project description:** The BLRT Extension is a light rail transit project (project) located in the cities of Minneapolis, Robbinsdale, Crystal, & Brooklyn Park. A Supplemental EIS (SEIS) is needed because it was necessary to move the project forward without using freight rail property & the modified route has potential for significant impacts. Based on technical considerations and community input, a modified route was recommended to advance by the Metropolitan Council and Hennepin County on June 22, 2022. The SEIS will study the following route: W. Broadway Ave in Brooklyn Park to Bottineau Blvd (County Road 81), CR 81 in Crystal & Robbinsdale to W. Broadway Ave in North Minneapolis, and multiple potential routes (W. Broadway Ave or 21st Ave; Lyndale or a route east of I-94) to Target Field Station.

Notice description: PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (Commission) and Minnesota Department of Commerce will hold public information and Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) scoping meetings on the application of Xcel Energy for a certificate of need and a route permit for the Mankato – Mississippi River Transmission Line Project. The proposed Project is a new approximately 130-mile 345kilovolt (kV) transmission line between the existing Wilmarth Substation in Mankato to the Mississippi River near Kellogg and a new 20-mile 161 kV transmission line between the existing North Rochester Substation near Pine Island and an existing transmission line northeast of Rochester. The Project may cross portions of Blue Earth, Le Sueur, Waseca, Rice, Dodge, Olmstead, Goodhue, Winona, and Wabasha counties. Project description: On April 2, 2024, Xcel Energy (Applicant) submitted applications to the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission for a Certificate of Need and a High-Voltage Transmission Line (HVTL) Route Permit for their proposed Mankato - Mississippi River 345 kV Transmission Line Project (Project) in southeast Minnesota. Xcel Energy indicated that the Project is needed to address loading and congestion issues on the existing 345 kV transmission system across southern Minnesota and Wisconsin and to provide reliable, resilient, and cost-effective delivery of energy as the generation resource mix continues to evolve over the coming years. Details for all public meetings: The purpose of the meetings is to: (1) provide information about the proposed project and the state's permitting process; and (2) provide an opportunity to participate in developing the scope of the Environmental Impact Statement, including alternative route segments. For the pre-meeting portion of the event, doors will open one hour prior to each meeting to provide attendees an opportunity to review the application, maps, and other materials for the proposed project and ask questions of state staff and the applicant. During this time, comments made by attendees will become a part of the record for Commission consideration only if the attendee submits the comment in writing. Forms will be available for this purpose. During the meeting, state staff and the applicant will both make presentations. State staff will explain the permitting and environmental review processes, and the applicant will provide an overview of the proposed project. Following the presentations, attendees will have the opportunity to offer oral and written comments for the record. The meetings will end when all attendees have had the opportunity to comment and all other business has been concluded, or the scheduled end time of the meeting,

whichever occurs first. The information presented will be the same at all in-person and online meetings.
