**Project Title: Trunk Highway 10 Elk River EA/EAW and Draft Section 4(f) Evaluation
(S.P. 7102-123)**

Description: The proposed project involves reconstruction of Highway 10 from an urban arterial roadway to a freeway design within Elk River between Upland Avenue/County Road 44 and the Highway 101/169 interchange. The project includes the construction of a grade-separated interchange at Upland/Proctor Avenues and a half interchange at Main Street (interchange ramps to and from the east). A one-way pair of frontage roads would connect interchange ramps at Upland/Proctor Avenues. At-grade intersections would be removed, and frontage roads along Highway 10 would be constructed to provide local access. The BNSF Railway would be realigned to the north, and grade-separated crossings would be constructed at Proctor Avenue, Jackson Avenue, and Main Street.

The purpose of the project is to address regional mobility, traffic operations and local connectivity/accessibility while serving as a guide for comprehensive planning in the City of Elk River. There is no funding in place for construction of the Preferred Alternative. This EA/EAW process is intended to support the anticipated future use of federal funding and to allow for land use and local transportation improvements, consistent with the proposed project, to be implemented over time as funding becomes available.

Project Title: Trunk Highway 169 (Elk River to Zimmerman) EA/EAW and Draft Section 4(f) Evaluation (S.P. 7106-71 and S.P. 7106-73)

Description: The proposed project includes reconstruction of Highway 169 to a freeway between Main Street in Elk River and CSAH 4 in Zimmerman, including redesign of the Highway 10/101/169 system interchange. The project includes improvements to Highway 101 from Highway 169 in Elk River to CSAH 39 in Otsego, including reconstruction of the Highway 101 bridge over the Mississippi River. The proposed project would remove at-grade intersections and signals along the project corridor. A system of interchanges, overpasses, and frontage/backage roads would replace existing at-grade intersections. A collector-distributor road design would be constructed providing full access interchanges at Main Street and School Street in Elk River. Interchanges

would also be constructed at Jackson Avenue/193rd Avenue/197th Avenue and 221st Avenue in Elk River. Interchanges would be constructed at CSAH 25/19 in Livonia Township and CSAH 4 in Zimmerman. The proposed project would result in consolidation and closure of access along Highway 169.

The purpose of the project is to address safety, mobility, and operational issues to maintain the functionality of Highway 169 as a principal arterial route. There is no funding in place for right of way acquisition or construction of the proposed project. This EA/EAW process is intended to support the anticipated future use of federal funding and to allow for improvements, consistent with the proposed project, to be implemented over time as funding becomes available. In the near term, this EA/EAW will be used to help inform local land use and transportation planning decisions.

NOTICE OF AMENDMENT TO EIS SCOPING DECISION

**Project Title: PolyMet NorthMet Mine and Ore Processing Project
Located Near Cities of Babbitt and Hoyt Lakes, St. Louis County, Minnesota**

Description: The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) in co-operation with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineer (USACE) and the U.S. Forest Service (USFS) is preparing a joint state and federal Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the NorthMet Mine and Ore Processing Facilities Project (NorthMet) proposed by PolyMet Mining Inc. (PolyMet). The DNR's Scoping Decision for this EIS was issued on October 25, 2005, and the DNR's EIS preparation notice published in the April 24, 2006, *EQB Monitor*.

This Notice of Amendment to the EIS Scoping Decision is being published pursuant to Minnesota Rules part 4410.2100, subpart 8, which in part requires a notice be published if "substantial new information arises relating to the proposed project that significantly affects the potential environmental effects of the proposed project or the availability of prudent and feasible alternatives to the project."

The USFS and USACE published a Notice of Intent to prepare a Supplemental Draft EIS in the *Federal Register* on October 13, 2010 (75 FR 62756). The Notice of Intent included a description of lands that would come into federal ownership in a proposed land exchange between the USFS and PolyMet. While the need for a land exchange was disclosed in the October 2009 Draft EIS, the EIS-preparing agencies had no information at that time regarding lands to be brought into federal ownership. The information now available is substantial new information that broadens the geographic scope of the EIS. The land exchange is a connected action to the proposed NorthMet Project and will be fully assessed in the EIS in accordance with state and federal law.

Updated EIS Schedule: The Supplemental Draft EIS preparation is expected in the summer of 2011, with Final EIS publication about six to nine months later.

CEDAR ISLAND LAKE RECLAMATION PROJECT PLANNED

CILHA with the Department of Natural Resources Fish and Wildlife Division

The CILHA and DNR Division of Fish & Wildlife are planning rotenone treatments on the following water bodies:

Cedar Island Lake-Hennepin County DOW# 27-119P

This project will include the application of Pentox –rotenone fish toxicant powder, a federally and state registered pesticide to control bullheads. The chemical application will occur in sometime between November 15th, 2010 and Dec. 15th 2010, most likely around the Nov. 22nd, weather permitting. Rotenone distribution will be done by boat mounted pump/sub surface injection method. Target treatment concentration will be a 3-5 ppm concentration of powdered rotenone, or a combination of liquid and powder. Smaller adjacent wetlands, ditches or drain tile outlets connected to the above lake maybe treated if necessary.

Endangered or threatened species are not known to be present in any of these lakes or wetlands. This project is not anticipated to have any long-term negative affects on any of endangered or threatened species. Project goals include treating the undesirable fish species, Bull heads, in order to improve wildlife habitat and water quality in these water bodies. This lake and wetland complex serves as a source of bullheads to downstream lakes. Down-stream lakes should benefit from better water quality including Eagle Lake and Pike. Also, one to three connected city ponds that have the same problem may be treated.
