Project Title: County Road 96 and US Highway 10 Grade Separation Project

Ramsey County encourages the public to attend a Public Hearing for the proposed Grade Separation of County Road 96 and US Highway 10 (S.P. 62-696-26 and 62-596-03). The proposed project is located in the City of Arden Hills, Ramsey County, Minnesota. The Open House and Public Hearing will be held Wednesday,

December 1, 2010 from 4:00 to 7:00 p.m. at the Ramsey County Public Works building located at 1425 Paul Kirkwold Dr.

The purpose of the Public Hearing is to inform the public about the project, and to encourage the public to comment and ask questions. Maps, drawings, and other pertinent information will be available for public inspection and copying including the Draft Environmental Assessment, other project documents, and written views received from local, state, and federal agencies. During the Open House the public will be able to discuss the project in an informal matter with Ramsey County and Mn/DOT officials. The proposed scope of the project includes the grade separation of the at-grade Hwy 10/County Rd 96 intersection and construction of ramps for westbound County Rd 96 to northbound Hwy 10 and southbound Hwy 10 to County Rd 96. The project also includes reconstruction of approximately 1/3 mile of County Road 96 east of I-35W as a four-lane divided roadway, signalized intersections at Round Lake Road W and Old Highway 10, a pedestrian/bicycle trail, and a sidewalk.

Project Title: Keetac Mine Expansion Project

Description: The Department of Natural Resources (MNDNR) has prepared a joint state-federal final Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) for the Keetac Mine Expansion Project. U.S. Steel Corporation is the project proposer.

The Proposed Project includes expanding an open-pit taconite mine, restarting an idle indurating line and upgrading plant components. The mine pit, and waste rock and overburden stockpile areas would be expanded. The tailings basin would grow vertically and the footprint would increase slightly. Tailings thickeners would be added. Additional haul trucks, shovels and other equipment would be put into service. A woody biomass facility would be added. New air emissions control technologies would be added as well as plant energy efficiency technologies.

The Proposed Project would increase Keetac's annual iron pellet production output by 3.6 million tons to a total output of 9.6 million tons per year. Iron ore pellets would be transported to offsite steel production facilities. The Proposed Project would be located near the City of Keewatin on the border of St. Louis and Itasca counties. The Proposed Project would begin in approximately the year 2013.

The final EIS discusses potential environmental impacts from the Proposed Project, a no action alternative, a stockpile alternative and options for stationary air emissions controls. The document also considers mitigation of adverse effects.

The purpose of the public information meeting is to provide information about the proposed project and to solicit public comment on the site permit application submitted by Lake Country and the draft site permit issued by the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (Commission). EFP staff will provide an overview of the state's wind energy site permitting process and the draft site permit. Representatives of Lake Country will be present to answer questions about the proposed project.

Project Description. The project is a proposed 41 megawatt (MW) wind farm to be located on approximately 16,047 acres of agricultural land in Kandiyohi and Meeker counties, near the city of Atwater, Minnesota. Lake Country, in its LWECS Site Permit Application, designated 16,047 acres of land as the project area. Upon completion of the project, approximately 19.4 acres of the 16,047 acres would be converted to turbines and associated infrastructure, as indicated by Lake Country.

Lake Country anticipates using an array of 20 REpower 2.05 MW MM92 wind turbines. The turbines would consist of 328 foot towers with 269 foot diameter rotors for a maximum wind turbine height of 479 feet. The project would also require the following associated facilities as identified in the permit application:

- pad mount transformers;
- collection lines:
- Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) communication lines;

- a project substation with switching and protection equipment, metering equipment, a small control house, and a 48 K transformer;
- turbine access roads:
- two temporary meteorological towers and one permanent meteorological tower; and
- an operations and maintenance facility (1 to 2 buildings with an approximate footprint of 3,000 to 5,000 square feet).

The project would interconnect to an existing Xcel Energy 69 kV transmission line with a proposed project substation in section 6 of Acton Township in Meeker County.

As indicated in the site permit application, Lake Country intends on commencing construction of the LWECS in August 2012, with commercial operation by December 31, 2012.

Review Process. EFP staff, on behalf of the Commission, is initiating the permit review process for this project under the Wind Siting Act (Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 216F) and the Wind Permitting Rules (Minnesota Rules 7854).

On August 4, 2010, Lake Country filed an application with the Commission for a site permit to build and operate a LWECS near Atwater, Minnesota. The Commission accepted the site permit application as complete on September 9, 2010. EFP staff solicited comments on issues to be considered in developing a draft site permit for this project until October 4, 2010. Staff prepared a draft site permit for consideration by the Commission. On October 22, 2010, the Commission issued an Order approving the draft site permit for distribution and public comment and authorized the EFP staff to implement the public participation process outlined in Minnesota Rules 7854.0900. Upon completion of this process, the EFP staff will present the record of this matter to the Commission for a final permit decision. Under the LWECS siting process, environmental review is incorporated into the development of the site permit application and the site permit itself; there is no separate environmental review document prepared on the project.

Contested Case Hearing Request. Any person may request a more formal contested case hearing on the site permit proceeding for the LWECS pursuant to Minnesota Rules 7854.0900. All contested case hearing requests must be filed with the Commission in writing by 4:30 p.m., Wednesday, December 15, 2010.

The person requesting the contested case hearing must list the issues sought to be addressed in the hearing and the reason why a contested case hearing is required to resolve those issues. The Commission shall order a contested case hearing if it finds that a material issue of fact has been raised and that the holding of the contested case hearing will aid the Commission in making a final decision on whether to authorize construction of the project.

Eminent Domain. Lake Country does not have the power of eminent domain to acquire the land or wind rights for the project. Wind and land rights necessary to build the LWECS facility must be in the form of voluntary easements or lease agreements between individual landowners and Lake Country.

In the Matter of the Route Permit Application for a 345 kV Transmission Line from Brookings County, South Dakota to Hampton, Minnesota

At meetings on July 13 and 15, 2010, and in an Order issued September 14, 2010, the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (Commission) issued a high-voltage transmission line route permit for Sections 1, 2, 3, 5 and 6 of the Brookings to Hampton 345 kV transmission line project to be located in Lincoln, Lyon, Yellow Medicine, Redwood, Renville, Scott, and Dakota counties and determined that the Environmental Impact Statement had adequately addressed the issues identified in the Scoping Decision for those Sections. Section 4, which would connect the Cedar Mountain Substation in Renville County on the west to the Helena Substation in Le Sueur County in the east, was remanded back to the Administrative Law Judge for further contested case proceedings in a separate Order issued by the Commission on July 27, 2010.
