These projects may include the application of 2.5% synergized liquid rotenone, a federally and state registered pesticide to control fish. Endangered or threatened species are not known to be present in any of these lakes or wetlands. Smaller wetlands, ditches or drain title outlets connected to the above lakes and wetland maybe treated if necessary. Some species listed as "Special Concern" in M.S. 6134.0220 maybe periodically found on/near some of these lake including Franklin's Gulls, American White Pelicans and Bald Eagles. These projects are not anticipated to have any long-term negative affects on any of these on any of these species. Project goals include treating undesirable fish species in order to improve wildlife habitat and water quality in these water bodies.

The target dates for the treatments of these basins are in October of 2010, however if favorable treatment conditions do not occur in October, treatment dates maybe extended into the winter if necessary. Rotenone distribution will be done by boat, drip station, or under ice if necessary. Target treatment concentration is 5 ppm of 2.5% liquid rotenone or a similar concentration of powdered rotenone, or a combination of liquid and powder. Benefits of the project will be to improved water quality and aquatic vegetation abundance creating habitat for wildlife and waterfowl.

Purpose and Conduct of the Hearing. The purpose of the public hearing is to receive input about the Project. During the public hearing, members of the public may offer either oral or written testimony, offer exhibits for inclusion in the public hearing record, and ask questions of the applicant and agency representatives. Any person who wishes to ask questions, but does not want to ask the questions personally, may submit them in writing to the ALJ who will then ask the question during the hearing.

Interested persons may comment on the certificate of need and site permit applications, environmental report, draft site permit, or on the Project generally. The hearing will continue until all persons have had the opportunity to offer testimony and ask questions. If needed, the hearing may be recessed and continued by the ALJ. At the close of the written comment period, Judge Krause will prepare a written summary of the comments received at the hearing and file it with the Commission, which will consider them in its deliberations of the certificate of need and site permit applications.

Environmental Report. The Office of Energy Security, Energy Facility Permitting, has completed and issued an environmental report for the proposed Paynesville Wind Farm. The environmental report addresses potential

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human and environmental impacts of the proposed project and alternatives. For a copy of the environmental report, please see project contacts and information below.

Draft Site Permit. On June 4, 2010, the Commission issued an order approving a draft site permit for distribution and public comment. A Notice of Availability of Draft Site Permit was issued on June 16, 2010. For a copy of the draft site permit, please see project contacts and information below.

Project Description. The Applicant proposes a Large Wind Energy Conversion System (LWECS) of 95 megawatts (MW). Depending on which turbines are selected, the wind turbine layout will consist of 42 to 63 turbines with a hub height of 80 meters (263 feet) and a rotor diameter of 82.5 meters (270 feet) if the General Electric 1.5 MW wind turbines are selected, 90 meters (295 feet) if the Vestas 1.8 MW wind turbines are selected, or 101 meters (331 feet) if the Siemens 2.3 MW wind turbines are selected. In addition to the wind turbines, the Project would include access roads, a meteorological tower, a Sonic Detection and Ranging unit or Light Detection and Ranging unit, an electrical collection system, project substation, a metering yard, transmission line, and an operations and maintenance building. Power will ultimately be delivered to the existing Paynesville substation.

The Project area (shown in the accompanying map) consists of approximately 15,000 acres located in Stearns County in Zion, Paynesville, Spring Hill, and Lake Henry townships. The Project area is located north of Paynesville and southeast of Lake Henry. Approximately 11,500 acres are under the Applicant's control via wind easements.

Eminent Domain. The Applicant does not have the power of eminent domain to acquire the land or wind rights for the project. Wind and land rights necessary to build the facility must be in the form of voluntary easements or lease agreements between individual landowners and the applicant.

Authority and Statement of Issues to Be Decided. In order to proceed with this Project, the Applicant must obtain a certificate of need and a site permit from the Commission. The Commission is authorized by Minnesota Statutes section 216B.243, to issue a certificate of need for a large energy facility if the applicant can demonstrate that there is a need for the Project. A certificate of need is a state permit that is issued upon a determination that construction of an energy facility is in the public interest. The Commission is required by Minnesota Statutes section 216B.243, subdivision 4, to hold a hearing on an application for a certificate of need.

The Commission is authorized by Minnesota Statutes section 216F.04 to issue LWECS site permits for certain wind energy facilities. When the Commission designates a site, it issues a site permit for the construction of a facility specifying the design, location, preparation, and operation of the facility, along with any other appropriate conditions it deems necessary. The Commission is required by Minnesota Statutes section 216F.05 and Minnesota Rule 7854.0900 to hold a public meeting on an application for a site permit for an LWECS.

Contested Case Hearing Request. Any person may request a more formal contested case hearing on the site permit proceeding for the LWECS pursuant to Minnesota Rule 7854.0900. All contested case hearing requests must be filed with Judge Krause in writing by 4:30 p.m. on **September 8, 2010**. The person requesting the contested case hearing must list the issues sought to be addressed in the hearing and the reason why a contested case hearing is required to resolve those issues. The Commission shall order a contested case hearing if it finds that a material issue of fact has been raised and that the holding of the contested case hearing will aid it in making a final decision on whether to authorize construction of the Project.



At its regular meeting on July 29, 2010, the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (Commission) determined that the Environmental Impact Statement and the record created at the public hearing had adequately addressed the issues identified in the Scoping Decision.

The Commission also designated the HVTL routes, permit conditions and issued the route permit.

The Commission's Order was released on August 2, 2010.

Project Description

NPUC and MP propose to construct four 230 kV transmission lines and two 230 kV substations. The purpose of the project is to supply reliable electric power to a single source entity - Essar Steel Minnesota (ESM). ESM has obtained state approvals to reactivate the former Butler Taconite mine by developing new facilities, including a taconite pellet plant and steel production plant. The Essar taconite pellet facility is expected to commence initial operation by early 2011, with initial steel plant operation planned for early 2014, at which time the projected demand would be approximately 300 megawatts. Although not committed to, ESM has site approvals for a second steel slab melt line, which would increase the ESM facilities' total electric power requirements to approximately 500-550 megawatts if constructed and at full operation.

The four routes would require approximately 37 miles of new transmission lines.
