

Changes are coming to the *Monitor* in 2017!

EQB Environmental Review Survey Updates

2016 Environmental Review Survey – Thank You!

In July 2016, EQB staff launched two pilot surveys for Responsible Governmental Units (RGU) that completed the environmental review process, and citizens that submitted petitions to the EQB. The surveys have provided valuable feedback on the timeliness, effectiveness, and outcomes of the environmental review process. EQB staff will present a summary of the results, along with other

environmental review data collected in 2016, to the Board in early 2017.

Thank you to all that have completed the survey! We have received responses from about 50% of RGUs and 60% of citizens invited to complete the survey. We would like to get these percentages higher as participation in the survey is critical to guiding future improvements to the EQB Environmental Review Program.

It's not too late to participate if you have not yet completed the survey. EQB staff will be sending a final survey reminder via email. Keep an eye out for the email and contact EQB staff with any questions.

2017 Environmental Review Survey for Proposers

The cows will be housed in a cross ventilated confinement free stall barn with the manure and wastewater collected and stored in earthen basins with impermeable covers.

Project Description: The proposed project will involve the redevelopment of an existing 15-acre manufactured home/RV park community, which holds 98 manufactured homes and 95 R.V. sites, into a combination of multi-family residential units (townhomes and apartments). The project is proposed to construct approximately 837 units.

Project Title: Lab USA's Ash Processing Project – Red Wing

Project Description: Lab USA plans to construct a transfer and ash processing facility consisting of a 30,000 square foot building (Process Building) to process 100,000 to 150,000 of combustor ash annually to recover ferrous and non-ferrous metals. This waste combustor ash is currently generated and landfilled in the Red Wing area. The two sources of waste combustor ash are the Xcel Energy Generating Plant and Xcel Energy Ash Landfill. The Proposer will locate the Process Building approximately 1.5 miles south of U.S. Highway 61 on Goodhue County State Aid Highway (CSAH) 1 (1540 Bench Street) (Project Site). The Project Site is adjacent to Xcel Energy's Red Wing Ash Disposal Landfill, and the Goodhue County/ Red Wing Land Disposal Landfill.

Environmental Impact Statement Preparation Notice

Project Title: Line 3 Pipeline Replacement Project

The Minnesota Department of Commerce is preparing an environmental impact statement (EIS) for Enbridge Energy's proposed Line 3 pipeline replacement project. Enbridge Energy, Limited Partnership (Enbridge) has applied for a certificate of need and a route permit from the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (Commission) to construct and operate the proposed project. The Commission has authorized the Department of Commerce Energy Environmental Review and Analysis unit (EERA) to prepare an EIS for the proposed project in consultation with the Commission's executive secretary. Commerce EERA is preparing the EIS in cooperation with the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources and the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency.

Enbridge's proposed 337-mile long route for the project would cross Kittson, Marshall, Pennington, Red Lake, Polk, Clearwater, Hubbard, Wadena, Cass, Crow Wing, Aitkin and Carlton counties in Minnesota. The proposed project also includes upgrades to existing pump stations at Clearbrook, Donaldson, Plummer and Viking; and construction of new pump stations at Backus, Cromwell, Palisade and Two Inlets. Upon completion of the project, Enbridge proposes to permanently deactivate the existing Line 3 pipeline and leave it in place.

The Commission approved the Final Scoping Decision Document (FSDD) for the EIS on November 30,

2016. The FSDD and other relevant documents are available at: http://mn.gov/commerce/energyfacilities/Docket.html?Id=34079.

In accordance with the FSDD, the EIS will analyze the following general topics:

- Pipeline deactivation or abandonment
- Greenhouse gas emissions and climate change
- Potential impacts of oil spills and leaks on area lakes, rivers, groundwater, and other natural resources such as wildlife, wild rice, and human settlements
- Unique tribal concerns (e.g., cultural resources, treaty rights, wild rice areas)
- Potential impacts to humans settlements and local economies
- Natural resource impacts (e.g. water, wetlands, wildlife, and natural communities)
- Cumulative potential effects
- Development of a new pipeline corridor

The EIS will analyze a variety of project alternatives including:

- Enbridge's proposed route
- Alternative technologies (including oil transport by truck and rail)
- Modified designs or layouts (including one system alternative, four route alternatives, and 24 route segment alternatives; see attached maps)
- Alternatives incorporating reasonable mitigation measures
- No action alternative





NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission and the Minnesota Department of Commerce will hold a public information and environmental report scoping meeting on the certificate of need and site permit applications by Blazing Star Wind, LLC, for its proposed 200 megawatt Blazing Star Wind Project in Lincoln County, Minnesota.

The purpose of the meeting is to provide information about the proposed project and the state's review process, and to accept verbal or written comments on potential issues for the environmental report and draft site permit that will be prepared.

Project Description

Blazing Star Wind Farm, LLC, has filed a site permit application with the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission for an up to 200 megawatt large wind energy conversion system. The proposed large wind energy conversion system would be comprised of 57 to 100 wind turbines ranging from 2 to 3.5 megawatts in size. Associated facilities include a project substation, an operation and maintenance building, access roads, meteorological towers, light range or sonic range detecting units, underground communication and electrical collection lines, transformers, and an approximately 1,000-foot long 345 kilovolt transmission line. The proposed project footprint would occupy approximately 37,200 acres of land located in Hansonville, Hendricks, and Marble townships in Lincoln County, Minnesota.

Written Comment Period

Comment Period: Written comments will be accepted through **Tuesday, December 27, 2016**. Please include the Commission's Docket Numbers (16-215 and 16-686) in all communications.

Please focus your comments on information that will help answer the following questions:

- What potential human and environmental impacts of the proposed project should be considered in the environmental document and the draft site permit?
- What are the possible methods to minimize, mitigate, or avoid potential impacts of the proposed project?
- Are there any **unique characteristics** of the proposed site or the project that should be considered?
- Are there any items missing or mischaracterized in the certificate of need or site permit Applications?

Comments will be made available to the public via the Commission's and the Department of Commerce's websites, except in limited circumstances, consistent with the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act. Personally identifying information is not edited or deleted from submissions.

Process Information

The Commission must approve a certificate of need and a site permit before the project can be built. The certificate of need and site permit applications are being processed jointly. This meeting satisfies the public meeting requirement for both the certificate of need application (Minnesota Rules 7849.1400) and site permit application (Minnesota Rules 7854.0900).

The Department of Commerce will issue an environmental report scoping decision, followed by an environmental report and a draft site permit. Upon completion of the environmental report and Commission approval of a draft site permit, a public hearing will be held. The public hearing will provide an opportunity for interested persons to ask questions and provide comments on the proposed project.
