Environmental Impact Statement Need Decision

County Road 26 & County Road 63 Improvement Project

Project Description: Dakota County and the Cities of Inver Grove Heights and Eagan are proposing to expand approximately 2 miles of County Road (CR) 26 (Lone Oak Road in Eagan, 70th Street in Inver Grove Heights) from Trunk Highway (TH) 55 to TH 3 from an existing two-lane roadway rural section to a four-lane divided (urban) highway. The roadway will include turn lanes, improved stormwater management infrastructure, multi-use trails on both sides of the roadway, and access management of residential driveways and city streets. CR 63 (Argenta Trail) will be reconstructed from Amana Trail north to 65th Street and from 65th Street to old Argenta Trail (CR 63) to the north of CR 26. The County Road 63 construction will be on new alignment and include two lanes, stormwater infrastructure and trails on both sides of the roadway. A new roundabout will be constructed at CR 26 and the realigned CR 63.

Interstate South Logistics Park AUAR Update

Comment Deadline: August 24, 2020

Project Description: The Interstate South Logistics Park AUAR study area is 175.8 acres located in the southwest corner of Dodd Boulevard and County Road 70 in the City of Lakeville, Dakota County, MN. As the Responsible Governmental Unit (RGU), the City of Lakeville adopted the Interstate South Logistics Park Final AUAR and Mitigation Plan in June 2015. Pursuant to Minnesota Rules, part 4410.3610, subpart 7, an AUAR and plan for mitigation must be revised every five years until all development in the study area has received final approval. Since the study area has not been fully developed, the purpose of this document is to update the Interstate South Logistics Park AUAR pursuant to Minnesota Rules. The City of Lakeville will accept written comments on the AUAR Update until 4:30 p.m. on August 24, 2020.

A contested case hearing will be held at the Office of Administrative Hearings, 600 North Robert Street, St. Paul, Minnesota 55101, *In the Matter of the Public Waters Restoration Order Relating to Daniel DeCook* (OAH Docket No. 5-2002-36859). This action was initiated to determine whether cause exists for the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources to direct the restoration of Public Water Kittle Number M-034-082 pursuant to Minn. Stat. §§ 84.0895 and 103G.251. The hearing will begin on August 25, 2020 at 9:00 a.m., before Administrative Law Judge James Mortenson. The hearing is scheduled to last two days. DNR proposes to return five watercourses to Public Waters Inventory

Comment Deadline: November 11, 2020

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) is seeking public comment on its proposal to correct errors in the Public Waters Inventory (PWI) by returning four watercourses in Renville County and one in Polk County to the PWI. The PWI identifies which waters are regulated by the DNR for the public's benefit.

The DNR has determined that these five watercourses have characteristics of a natural stream and meet the statutory definition of a public water as an altered or natural watercourse having a total drainage area greater than two square miles. As public waters, these watercourses have been and will remain subject to all applicable public waters regulations, regardless of whether they are included in the PWI. These watercourses are subject to regulation as public waters and should be identified on the PWI. Public water regulations include a requirement to secure public waters work permits for some activities within the watercourse and compliance with the buffer law.

In April of 2017, 640 miles of watercourses in 70 counties were removed from the PWI through a DNR Commissioner's Order. The changes were a result of the DNR buffer mapping project, which revealed that some watercourses were not clearly identified as public waters at the time of the original inventory. Part of the 2017 Commissioner's Order stated, "The DNR may review the subject watercourses for possible inclusion in the PWI in the future, subject to requisite public comment opportunity prior to any additions to the PWI."

Written comments should be submitted to Public Waters Inventory Corrections, Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, 500 Lafayette Road, St. Paul, MN 55155-4025, or PWIreview.dnr@state.mn.us. Comments cannot be submitted by phone and will be accepted only via email or postal mail. Questions can be asked by email, postal mail or by calling 651-259-5654. The DNR will respond to comments as part of developing the decision document and order. The order will be mailed to all commenters, affected landowners and county officials. Public notification of the decision will also be made through media outlets.
