Forsman Farms - Litchfield Farm

Project Description: Forsman Farms, Inc. proposes to construct and operate a new 4,950 animal unit poultry feedlot (1,650,000 head) in Section 15 of Harvey Township, Meeker County. The construction will include five power ventilated total confinement poultry barns, a manure storage building, a pelletizing building, an egg packing plant, permanent stormwater basins, and 10 water supply wells.

Otter Tail Power Norcross 115-kV Project EA

Comment Deadline: September 2, 2020

Project Description: Grant County is the local government unit responsible for approval and permitting of the proposed Otter Tail Power Norcross 115-kV Project in Elbow Lake, Delaware, and Groton Townships. The proposed project includes construction of a new 115-kV substation northeast of Norcross, as well as constructing approximately eight (8) miles of 115-kV transmission line from the new Norcross Substation to the Grant County Switching Station one mile southwest of the city of Elbow Lake. The existing Grant County Switching Station will be expanded by the owner, Missouri River Energy Services, to accommodate the additional 115-kV lines. The proposed transmission line would have single wood pole structures and would mainly follow a proposed route adjacent to roads and highway right-of-ways. The comment deadline is September 2, 2020.
