## Project Title: Lake Shamineau High Water Project

Comment Deadline: March 25, 2020

**Project Description:** Lake Shamineau's water levels have risen in recent years to a lake level almost 2.5 feet above ordinary high water level causing flood damage to residences and infrastructure as well as severe shoreline erosion. The Lake Shamineau Lake Improvement District is proposing to construct a water level control outlet to remove excess water by pumping water to infiltration basins northeast of the lake.

## **Project Title: Capstone 500**

**Project Description:** The Capstone 500 AUAR reviews two development scenarios on 560 acres adjoining Uhl Lake in south-central St. Michael. Scenario 1 includes up to 1,900 residential units, 435,600 square feet of retail-office floor space, and 55 acres of parks and ball fields. Scenario 2 includes up to 1,179 residential units, 435,600 square feet of retail-office floor space, 48 acres of parks and ball fields, and 147 acres of agricultural land use. Both scenarios include installation of municipal utilities and best management practices to protect water resources. Agencies have ten days from the date of receipt of the Final AUAR to file an objection. The City of St. Michael will consider adoption of this Final AUAR and Mitigation Plan at its City Council meeting on March 24, 2020
