Project Description: PLACE is redeveloping nine brownfield parcels into a mixed-use, environmentally sustainable, transit-oriented community. The project will include: 299 mixed-income living spaces, including live/work space for artists; a 110-room hotel; retail space; and neighborhood amenities like an urban forest. The project also includes an e-generation facility that will digest all compostable materials generated on-site.

Project Title: Removal of Utility Tunnels at the Fergus Falls Regional Treatment Center

Comment Deadline: April 5, 2017

Project Description: The campus of the Fergus Falls Regional Treatment Center (FFRTC) historically included a series of utility tunnels connecting the various buildings. These tunnels were designed for distribution of utilities including water, steam heat, and electrical power to the various buildings. To a very limited extent they were also used for delivery of materials to the various buildings during inclement weather. This proposed project will remove the utility tunnels at the FFRTC. These unused tunnels are structurally unsound and are partially filled with water. In areas the advanced deterioration limits vehicular movement above the tunnels.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission will hold a public hearing on the certificate of need and site permit applications by Blazing Star Wind, LLC, for its proposed 200 megawatt Blazing Star Wind Project in Lincoln County, Minnesota.

The Honorable Jessica A. Palmer-Denig, an Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) with the Office of Administrative Hearings, will administer this hearing. The purpose of this hearing is to receive comments regarding the proposed project, the environmental report issued by the Department of Commerce, and the draft site permit issued by the Commission.

Project Description

Blazing Star Wind Farm, LLC, has filed certificate of need and site permit applications with the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission for an up to 200 megawatt large wind energy conversion system. The proposed large wind energy conversion system would be comprised of 57 to 100 wind turbines ranging from 2 to 3.5 megawatts in size. Associated facilities include a project substation, an operation and maintenance building, access roads, meteorological towers, light range or sonic range detecting units, underground communication and electrical collection lines, transformers, and an approximately 1,000-foot long 345 kilovolt transmission line. The proposed project footprint would occupy approximately 37,200 acres of land located in Hansonville, Hendricks, and Marble townships in Lincoln County, Minnesota.

Written Comment Period

Comment Period: A comment period is open from the date of this notice until **Thursday, March 30, 2017.** Please include the Commission's Docket Numbers (16-215 and 16-686) and OAH Docket Number (71-2500-34030) in all communications.

Please focus your comments on information that will help answer the following questions:

- Should the Public Utilities Commission issue a certificate of need and a site permit for the project?
- Is the proposed project needed and in the public interest and are there any of the factors under Minn. R. 7853.0130 (certificate of need criteria) that have particular importance in this case?
- What are the environmental and human impacts of the project under consideration and how can these impacts be addressed in the site permit?
- Are there other project-related issues or concerns?

Important: Comments received after the comment period closes may not be considered. Comments will be made available to the public via the Commission's and the Department of Commerce's websites, except in limited circumstances, consistent with the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act. Personally identifying information is not edited or deleted from submissions.

Process Information

The Commission must approve a certificate of need and a site permit before the project can be built. The certificate of need and site permit applications are being processed jointly. This hearing satisfies the public hearing requirement for the certificate of need application (Minn. R. 7829.2500, subp. 9) and the public information meeting requirement for the site permit application (Minn. R. 7854.0800, subp. 4).

On Monday, February 27, 2017 the Commission issued a draft site permit for the 200 megawatt Blazing Star Wind Project in accordance with Minn.R. 7854.0800, subp. 3. The draft site permit does not authorize a person to construct the project. The Commission may change the draft site permit in any respect before a final permit is issued or may deny the site permit. The draft site permit is available for review on the Commission's eDocket system.

In March 2017, the Department of Commerce will issue an environmental report for the certificate of need component of the project. The public hearing will provide an opportunity for interested persons to provide comments on the draft site permit and the environmental report.

Following the written comment period ending March 30, 2017, the applicant will have the opportunity to respond to the comments made. The ALJ will submit findings of fact, conclusions of law, and recommendation to the Commission. The Commission will schedule a meeting to consider the matters, anticipated in June 2017.
