Project Description: Jones Lang LaSalle is proposing an expansion to the existing Rosedale Center in Roseville, MN. The proposed expansion includes 350 market rate residential units, 215 active adult housing units, two hotels with up to 340 hotel rooms, 90,000 square feet of office, and 200,000 square feet of retail space.

Alternative Urban Areawide Review Adoptions

Project Title: Jackson Township AUAR

On behalf of the City of Shakopee, SRF Consulting Group is transmitting the Revised Alternative Urban Area Review (AUAR) and Mitigation Plan for Jackson Township. The AUAR study area includes 2,890 acres of land in Jackson Township to the southwest of the City of Shakopee. This area is included in an existing Orderly Annexation Agreement between the city and township. The AUAR analyzes the potential for impacts within the area as the result of development as proposed within the City's 2040 Comprehensive Plan. While no specific development layouts have been determined within the study area, the AUAR assesses the potential for impact based on the land uses of the 2040 plan and existing regulations. There is currently no timeline established for development within the study area.

The revised AUAR has been revised to reflect comments received on the Draft AUAR. All comments received and the corresponding responses are included in the AUAR Appendix. According to Minnesota Rules 4410.361 Subp. 5D, objections may be filed by State Agencies and the Met Council within 10 days of the receipt of the AUAR (March 7, 2019).

In the Matter of the Certificate of Need Application for the Buffalo Ridge Wind Project

Docket Number: IP-7006/CN-19-309

The Minnesota Department of Commerce has issued an Environmental Report (ER) for the proposed Buffalo Ridge Wind Project. The ER analyzes the potential human and environmental impacts of the proposed project and alternatives to the project.

The ER will also be available for review at the public library in the cities of Lake Benton, Tyler, and Pipestone.

Project Description

Buffalo Ridge Wind, LLC (Buffalo Ridge Wind) is proposing to construct a 109 megawatt (MW) wind farm in Lincoln County and Pipestone County, Minnesota. The Buffalo Ridge Wind project would consist of wind turbines and associated facilities, including access roads, communication lines, underground electrical collector lines, a meteorological tower, a staging and construction laydown area, an operation and maintenance facility, and a project substation. Buffalo Ridge Wind anticipates that the project would consist of up to 40 wind turbines varying in size from 2.2 to 2.8 MW.

Process Information

In order to construct the proposed Buffalo Ridge Wind project, Buffalo Ridge Wind must obtain two approvals from the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (Commission) – a certificate of need and a site permit. Department of Commerce Energy Environmental Review and Analysis (EERA) staff is responsible for conducting environmental review for certificate of need applications submitted to the Commission. EERA staff has prepared the above-noted ER to meet this responsibility.

The ER evaluates the potential human and environmental impacts of the project and alternatives to the project. The ER will be used by the Commission in deciding whether to issue a certificate of need for the project.
