Project Title: Highway 23 North Gap:2-lane to 4-lane Conversion Project from Paynesville to Richmond

Comment Deadline: November 15, 2017

Project Description: The project will convert TH 23 from the City of Paynesville to the City of Richmond from its current configuration as a two-lane highway section, to a four-lane divided highway section. The project length is approximately 8.7 miles and is located within Stearns County.

Project Title: Chester Creek Trout Unlimited Restoration Project

Comment Deadline: November 15, 2017

Project Description: The project will restore the current 1,900 feet of stream to 2,500 feet in Chester Creek, a designated trout stream that runs through Duluth, MN. Natural Channel Design methodology will be used to re-align and daylight the creek, which is currently channelized (1,100 feet) and buried (700 feet). A fish passage barrier will also be removed. The project will be divided into Phase 1 – upstream County-owned section and Phase 2 – downstream privately-owned section.

Project Title: Northland Office Center, Virginia, MN – Building Deconstruction

Comment Deadline: November 15, 2017

Project Description: The Northland Office Center (NOC) in Virginia, Minnesota was constructed in 1923 as a Recreation Building and used in 1947 as a shirt factory. St. Louis County has owned and occupied the NOC for County Departments since 2003. The NOC is listed in the National Register of Historic Places as the Virginia Recreation Building. St. Louis County is planning for the deconstruction of the NOC in Virginia, Minnesota. CR-Building Performance Specialists, Inc. led a team of consultants for the completion of a Facility Condition Assessment Report for St. Louis County and determined that rehabilitation of the NOC building to meet the new Virginia Government Service Center project goals would not be feasible. By the Order of the St. Louis County Board of Commissioners, a Notice of Sale for the purchase of the NOC was issued on August 25, 2015 with a closing date of October 4th, 2016. There was no serious interest in the purchase of the building. A new building to serve as the Virginia Government Service Center will be constructed on the property located across 1st Street South which currently serves as a parking lot. Completion of the new Government Service Center is planned for 2019. Following relocation of the county employees to the new service center, the NOC will be deconstructed to make room for a new civic plaza and public parking in the downtown area.
