# **Project Title: Lowell Franzen Feedlot**

**Description:** Lowell Franzen is proposing the construction of a new swine gestation and farrowing facility in Section 30 of Lyle Township in Mower County. The total confinement, mechanically ventilated facility will consist of a gestation barn with a maximum physical capacity of 4,064 sows (1,626 animal units), and a farrowing barn with a maximum physical capacity of 768 sows (307 animal units) and 1,280 nursery pigs (64 animal units). Manure will be collected in reinforced concrete pits located beneath the barns. Each spring and fall, the manure will be pumped from the facility and injected at agronomic rates into designated cropland as fertilizer

# Decision on Environmental Assessment Worksheet for Ryan Contracting Company Mining and Excavation Project

On January 16, 2007, the Prior Lake City Council reviewed the Environmental Assessment Worksheet 9EAW) for the Ryan Contracting proposal located in Prior Lake. Based on the criteria listed in Minnesota Rules 4410.1700, Subd. 7, the Council determined there is a need for additional environmental review on this project. The city council ordered the preparation of an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) to address the following issues:

- a) Effects from additional traffic and number and size of the trucks on the adjacent roadway;
- b) Effect on the safety of people traveling in the vicinity with those trucks;
- c) Effects of higher noise decibels;
- d) Health effects of dust and diesel for a continuous four-year period on the church and the elderly who will be living there;
- e) Effect on surface water and groundwater in the vicinity;
- f) Effect on the SMSC drinking water supply that is within 100 yards of this area;
- g) Effects of stacking of trucks and accessing CSAH 42 from McKenna Road without traffic light;
- h) Potential enforcement issues as it relates to traffic generated by the mining operation on the other users in the area.

# FINAL EIS ADEQUACY DECISION

**Project Title: 3 Bays on Vermilion** 

St. Louis County prepared an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for 3 Bays on Vermilion, a residential subdivision proposed by U.S. Steel Corporation (USS). USS proposes a subdivision of up to 170 single-family residential lots on approximately 1,400 acres of property on the south shore of Lake Vermilion in the town of Breitung, approximately two miles east of the city of Tower.

A Scoping Environmental Assessment Worksheet and a draft Scoping Decision were prepared to identify the issues and alternatives that would be addressed in the EIS. A notice of the availability of the scoping documents was published in the EQB *Monitor* on February 14, 2005. A public scoping meeting was held on Thursday, March 17, 2005 in the council chambers of the Biwabik city hall. A final Scoping Decision was issued and the EIS preparation notice was published in the EQB *Monitor* on August 1, 2005.

The Draft EIS was prepared to address the issues and alternatives raised in scoping and identify reasonable mitigation measures for identified adverse effects. Public meetings were held in Tower on December 6, 2005 and March 30, 2006 to solicit input during preparation of the Draft EIS. The Draft EIS notice of availability was published in the EQB *Monitor* on May 22, 2006. A public information meeting was held on June 22, 2006, and comments were accepted on the Draft EIS through July 7, 2006.

St. Louis County prepared a Final EIS, which included responses to all comments received during the Draft EIS review period. The Final EIS notice of availability was published in the EQB *Monitor* on December 18, 2006. St. Louis County accepted comments on the adequacy of the Final EIS through January 23, 2007. St. Louis County received five comments during the Final EIS review period.

On January 23, 2007, pursuant to the criteria prescribed in Minnesota Rules part 4410.2800, subpart 4, the St. Louis County Board determined the EIS is adequate. St. Louis County prepared a record of its decision and distributed it to all parties receiving copies of the Final EIS.

**Project Title: The Minnesota Urban Ballpark** 

**Description:** Hennepin County has prepared a state Draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the proposed construction of the Minnesota Urban Ballpark, a new 42,000 seat (maximum), open-air baseball stadium for use by the Minnesota Twins. The Project includes the Ballpark structure and associated infrastructure improvements surrounding the Ballpark Site. The Project Area is located one block northwest of the Target Center in Downtown Minneapolis, Hennepin County, Minnesota.

Hennepin County will accept comments on the Draft EIS during the public review and comment period that concludes March 6, 2007. Written comments should be submitted to Chuck Ballentine, Deputy Coordinator, Hennepin County, Hennepin County Ballpark Project Office, 390 Grain Exchange Building, 400 South Fourth Street, Minneapolis, Minnesota 55415. Hennepin County will hold a public informational meeting for the purpose of considering public comments on the Draft EIS. The public meeting will be held on Tuesday, February 20, 2007 beginning at 2:30 pm in the Hennepin County Board Room, 24th Floor, Hennepin County Government Center, 300 South Sixth Street, Minneapolis, Minnesota 55487. Verbal and written comments on the Draft EIS will be accepted at the meeting.

The Central Library, located at 300 Nicollet Mall, Minneapolis, will have both a hardcopy version and an electronic version of the Draft EIS available. The other 14 Minneapolis Public Libraries will have electronic copies of the document available.
