Project Title: 34th Street Corridor and Interstate 94 Interchange Project

Description: The City of Moorhead 34th Street South interchange and corridor improvements involve the construction of 34th Street South as a four-lane, divided roadway from 12th Avenue South to Interstate (I) 94, a new I-94/34th Street interchange, and construction of a new extension of 34th Street South to 30th Avenue South and County State Aid Highway 52 (CSAH 52). The new I-94/34th Street interchange will provide full access between I-94 and 34th Street South. The existing interchange ramps at SE Main Avenue/CSAH 52 will be removed with the proposed project. The City will realign the portion of County Road (CR) 77 impacted by the new I-94/34th Street interchange.

DRAFT SITE PERMIT AVAILABLE For the Proposed Comfrey Wind Energy Project MPUC Docket No. IP6630/WS-07-318 **PLEASE TAKE NOTICE** that Comfrey Wind Energy, LLC (the Applicant) has applied to the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (PUC) for a site permit to build and operate a 31.5 Megawatt (MW) large wind energy conversion system (LWECS) near Comfrey, Minnesota.

The Minnesota Department of Commerce (DOC) Energy Facilities Permitting Unit will hold a public information meeting at 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, November 1, 2007 at the Comfrey Community Center. The meeting will provide an overview of the state's wind energy site permitting process and the proposed draft site permit for the Comfrey Wind project. The public information meeting and comment period will provide the public an opportunity to ask questions about the project, the process and the draft site permit. Representatives of DOC and the applicant will be at the meeting to describe the proposed project and answer questions.

Prior to the public information meeting, the applicant will host an open house beginning at 5:30 p.m. The applicant's representatives will be available at the open house to discuss the project and answer questions.

Project Description

The applicant proposes to build a 31.5 MW LWECS utilizing 15 Suzlon Energy S-88 2.1 MW wind turbine generators mounted on freestanding tubular steel towers. The rotor diameter will be approximately 288 feet. The turbines are approximately 262 feet (80 meters) at hub height, with a maximum overall height of the wind turbines of approximately 397 feet when a turbine blade is in the vertical position. An electrical system consisting of 34.5 kV collection lines routed to the new Comfrey Wind Substation will deliver the power to the grid. Other project associated facilities will include pad mounted step-up transformers and access roads.

Proposed Site Location

As shown on the accompanying map, the proposed project site is located approximately one mile west of the city of Comfrey and includes a portion of Bashaw Township in Brown County and portions of Selma Township in Cottonwood County. The total wind plant project site and land easements cover approximately 3,940 acres. The total development consists of approximately 15 acres of land that will be taken out of agricultural production for turbines and access roads.

MPUC Site Permit Review Process

Comfrey Wind Energy, LLC, filed a site permit application with the PUC for the project on July 20, 2007, and it was accepted by the Commission in an order dated August 9, 2007. Copies of the Comfrey Wind Energy site permit application have been distributed to affected landowners, township, county and state officials.

The PUC determined that a permit may be issued in this case and issued a draft site permit on September 7, 2007. The DOC is now initiating the public participation process on the site permit application under the Wind Siting Act (Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 216F) and the Wind Permitting Rules (Minnesota Rules, Chapter 7836). No separate environmental review document will be prepared under this process. Upon completion of the public participation process, the DOC will present the record of this matter to the PUC for a final decision.

The PUC shall order a contested case hearing if it finds that a material issue of fact has been raised and that the holding of the hearing will aid the PUC in making a final decision on the site permit application and draft site permit.
